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GUIDED BY COMMUNITY AND RECOVERY

It is a special pleasure to host the NAATP community in our association's home state on the occasion of our 40th Anniversary. We look forward to celebrating together, learning together, and addressing some challenging concerns together.

The conference begins this year with a **New Sunday Night Opening Banquet** where we will reflect on our work, take stock of the current treatment environment, and celebrate the achievements of our 2018 Addiction Leadership Award recipients. We will hit the ground running Monday morning with a presentation on the state of our association and the NAATP **Quality Assurance Initiative (The QAI)** that is guiding our response to the field's difficulties and charting a path to high quality values-based care.

The QAI is our roadmap. Its objective is to distinguish the NAATP addiction provider as a high quality, values based, ethical program upon which the field, consumer, policy maker, and payer may rely. With the new **NAATP Ethics Code 2.0** in hand, the QAI is comprised of 29 guidelines within eight core competencies of Operations, Admissions, Training and Credentialing, Billing, Discharge and Continuing Care, Outcomes Measures, Community Engagement, and Marketing and Visibility. (Please see page 66 of this program for a complete listing of the guidelines.) The guidelines will be compiled and defined in a **NAATP Member Guidebook**, which we are currently drafting. We will begin to release these principles at the conference through the General Sessions and the QA Workshop Track that is the start of a new kind of curriculum for us.

As we convene this year, amidst a palpable discomfort about our environment, I challenge us to keep two guiding principles at the forefront of our dialogue: **Community and Recovery**. Our difficulties as a profession spring from lack of community. They are the products of separateness and selfishness. This must change, and it is changing. NAATP will be the place where community and shared progress toward a shared goal exist against a sea of others who do not share this view or our values. After all, our purpose is to produce Recovery. While there is much talk in the national dialogue about treatment, frequently absent from that talk is a discussion of the end goal of treatment: recovery. It is recovery on which we must focus, and we know that ultimately, recovery, true recovery, not just abstinence or survival, occurs through human transformation. It is the process of a human being transforming from a sick person to a well person, a person who lives a healthy directed life all the while striving to reach his or her full potential. Community and Recovery: that is why we came together 40 years ago and that is how we will stay together today.

The National Association and the Quality Assurance Initiative – The QAI

Following a welcome by 2018 Conference Co-Chairs, **Robert Ferguson** and **Annie Peters**, **Marvin Ventrell**, NAATP Executive Director will set the table for all the conference sessions to come through the context of the NAATP's new QAI – The Quality Assurance Initiative. The QAI is the structure through which The National Association is addressing the field's need to come together, establish values, enforce ethical behavior, and move the field toward a trajectory of 21st century best practices in the delivery of addiction treatment.

The NAATP Outcomes Pilot Program 2015 – 2018

The NAATP 3-year Outcomes Study is coming to an end. Soon, the outcomes team will complete the analysis of data and NAATP will deliver the new Outcomes Measurement Toolkit to our members, enabling them to finally engage in their own all important tested and validated outcomes studies. This is a critical component of the QAI.

In 2015 the National Association for Addiction Treatment Providers (NAATP) partnered with OMNI Institute (OMNI), a nonprofit research and evaluation firm in Denver, Colorado, to conduct the Outcomes Pilot Program (OPP). The OPP is a collaborative research effort with eight NAATP member organizations designed to establish protocols, surveys, and data collection best practices for patient outcomes measurement. Data were collected from 748 patients at inpatient addiction treatment facilities of varying sizes across the United States. Patients were surveyed at intake to treatment and at five additional time points over the course of the year following intake. Data collection for the OPP was completed in April 2018. In this presentation, NAATP and OMNI will share preliminary findings, lessons learned, and a preview of the OPP Toolkit that will be available to all NAATP member organizations. The presentation will also include a discussion of planned next steps for NAATP's outcomes data collection research initiatives.
